4th CONSORTIUM MEETING Brussels, 29th April 2015



“Congratulations to all project partners”

The project review of the period from 01/03/2014 to 28/02/2015 demonstrated that the MasterMind project has achieved its objectives well - the indicated milestones have been achieved and deliverables, well written and coherent, have been submitted on time.

The review meeting also demonstrated that the organisational, administrative, technical and scientific management have been very effective during this year.

In view of the above, the Commission considers that the project has shown good progress for the period under review.

Welcome & Introduction

After a warm welcome by **Claus Duedal Pedersen** and **Carmen Ceinos**, both from “Region of Southern Denmark” (RSD), the agenda was approved. There were 43 participants who were informed that, on the previous day, the project reviewers had congratulated the Consortium on the results so far. 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Word package summaries

WP5 : Internet based guided cCBT for treatment of depression - 1st wave

Anne Etzelmüller from Schön Klinik (SCHOEN), presented the status and informed the meeting of the following outstanding issues:

- ✓ How can expertise be offered at national level, especially in countries with Bismarckian systems?
- ✓ There is a need to focus on documenting lessons learned and knowledge transfer in the Intermediate trial report as well as on data capture.
- ✓ When do patients 'count', i.e. patients for whom we have good data, or patients being treated? If patients have agreed to participate and have been issued with a log-in for the platform, then they are part of project target of 5,000. But ideally we should try to have good data for as many as possible.
- ✓ Patients who agree to participate but never log-in are also an important finding.
- ✓ There is a need to capture local trial protocols for the intermediate trial report, including what happened before the trial started and the organisational aspects. **Reinhard Prior**, Health Information Management SA (HIM), and **Christiaan Vis** from VU University Amsterdam (VUA) will circulate a template to collect the information before the end of May.
- ✓ The recruitment numbers need to be closely monitored on a monthly basis.

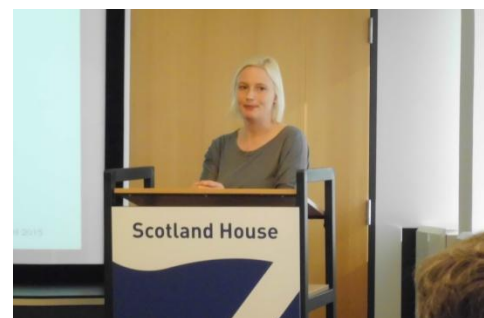
WP6 : Internet based guided cCBT for treatment of depression - 2nd wave

Ane Fullaondo Zabala from Asociacion Centro de Excelencia Internacional en Investigacion sobre Cronicidad – Basque Center for Health Services, Research and Chronicity (KRONIKGRUNE) underlined the following issues:

- ✓ '2nd wavers' will be chased for the same information on recruitment as 1st wavers!
- ✓ The evaluation reports should highlight the extent to which MasterMind data are integrated into EHRs.

WP7 : ccVC

Erlend Bønes, Norwegian Centre for Integrated Care and Telemedicine (NST), talked about the definition of service and pointed out that within MasterMind, service needs to move beyond the technical aspects to how it is used within treatment protocols. The partners need information from more experienced personnel in the use of CCVC of implementing the solutions (WP7 Workshop). There is the proposal by Siri Bjorvig from NST to revise the definition of the service, putting more emphasis on the medical aspects of the use of CCVC. Reinhard Prior should participate in next WP7 teleconference to advise on the definition of the service(s).



Pilot evaluation and deployment planning (WP3)

Reinhard Prior and Silvia Mancin from Azienda Unita Locale Socio Sanitaria N 9 Di Treviso (ULSS9) highlighted the following :

- ✓ Qualitative part of generic protocol: Christiaan Vis (VUA) is looking at focus groups and will make proposals for discussion with all partners.
- ✓ Silvia Mancin talked about the difficulty to plan when qualitative questionnaires or the tool for data collection will be ready, due to the delay on the data base activities (scheduled to be finished by the end of February).

Dissemination and communication (WP2)

A point of discussion was the use of Facebook; it was concluded that it will not be used at project level. However, it can be used at local level as a useful communication tool.

Participants were reminded about the need to upload dissemination activities on the web and to update the dissemination excel sheet in Dropbox (WP2)

The project partners will be asked to identify a blog leader for every organisation. A document with the planning of the activities will be circulated and each partner will be requested to write 1 post on 1 topic (presentation by **Mette Atipei Craggs and Lea Bohn (RSD)**).

Liaison with other relevant EU and non-EU initiatives

Claus Pedersen (RSD) pointed out that partners should inform each other about projects (e.g. E-Compared) which are related to MasterMind, and in which they are involved. In order to achieve sustainability, more involvement in national and regional activities from ministries and alignment with their agendas might be needed.

WP4 Advisory Boards Management

Three Advisory Boards – Patient, Professional and Committed Regions - are being established to bring together representatives of different categories of stakeholder.

These Boards agreed to:

- ✓ Receive information and learning, and disseminate this within their membership, states or regions.
- ✓ Provide advice and guidance as required, facilitated through a request process from Work Package Leaders and trial sites.
- ✓ Share useful information, reports or learning from their own local cCBT activity if this exists, or other information and learning that they believe is relevant or useful to the MasterMind project.
